Unit 2 Competitions

Like + -ing

- We use like + -ing to talk about a general feeling which is true now.
- For example:
- Richard likes skiing a lot.
- Ella doesn't like listening to rap music.

Affirmative Sentences

- Subject + like + verb+ing + rest of sentence
- I like watching action movies

Negative Sentences

- Subject + auxiliary do/does + not + Like + verb+ing + rest of sentence
- She does not like playing in the park.

Question

- Auxiliary do/does + subject + like + verb+ing + rest of question + ?
- Does he like playing in the park?

Would like to

- We use would like to to talk about a future ambition.
- For example: I would like to visit France next year.
- She would not like to compete in the Ironman.

Affirmative Sentences

- Subject + would like to + verb + rest of sentence.
- They would like to go there tomorrow.

Negative Sentences

- Subject + would + not + like to + verb + rest of sentence
- They would not like to go there tomorrow.

Questions

- Would + subject + like to + verb + rest of question + ?
- Would they like to go there tomorrow?
