Creativity	Very original presentation of material; uses the unexpected to full advantage; captures audience's attention	10	
Content (35 points)	Introduction is attention-getting, lays out the problem well, and establishes a framework for the rest of the presentation.	5	
	Technical terms are well-defined in language appropriate for the target audience.	5	
	Presentation contains accurate information.	10
